Easter Garden

The Easter break is fast approaching and some parents may like to help their children make an Easter Garden for a display at school. They are easy and fun to make and you can be as creative as you like. There are many good examples to explore on the internet but here is a brief guide should you need one.

You will need:

- * A shallow tray or dish
- *Garden soil or potting compost
- *Moss, cut grass or sand
- *Dried twias
- *String or thread
- *Small pot
- *Flat stone large enough to cover the mouth of the pot
- *Egg cups (or other small containers)
- *Small flowers
- *Gravel

To Make:

- 1. Fill the tray or dish with soil or potting compost.
- 2. Arrange it to make a hill on one side of the tray.
- 3. Cover the soil with moss, grass, small plants or sand.
- 4. Make three crosses with dried twigs tied together with sewing thread and place on the hilltop.
- 5. Press the small pot into the hillside to make a cave like the garden tomb. Place the stone over the mouth of the tomb.
- 6. Press egg-cups or small containers full of water into the soil around the garden and fill with flowers.
- 7. Make a path coming from the tomb with gravel.
- 8. Move back the stone from the tomb showing that it is empty.

The children can bring them to school on Monday to share in assembly and keep them in school for the week. Thank you.
