REMOTE LEARNING PLAN

Spring 2021

Below is an outline of ways we are educating the children who attend Pott Shrigley during the current lockdown. They are not rigid plans and, as when we are physically present in the classroom, we will be responding to the needs of the children and the resources and time available to them as best we can.

We expect the children to do some learning in **maths and English (reading, writing or spoken language) every day. The younger children will also need to do some work on phonics.** We will aim to guide the children into also completing topic, RE, science etc on a rolling programme and hope that we can encourage them to do some **physical activity** every day as well. We may use BBC Bitesize and/or Oak National Academy for online learning and have prepared work on paper to send home with children where possible.

Yoga lessons are provided weekly by our teacher, Milena, via our YouTube channel and a KICKSTART PE activity booklet has also been delivered.

Class 1

Tapestry

Tapestry is the main form of communication for Class 1. All parents have access to this. All work will be uploaded on here alongside the home learning packs that parents have received.

Parents receive a weekly timetable for their child which outlines which maths, literacy, phonics and handwriting tasks children should be completing daily. As well as this, weekly geography, science, RE and art/wellbeing tasks are sent. To support this, videos will be uploaded regularly with handwriting, phonics and literacy inputs.

Parents are encouraged to upload their children's work daily or weekly so that ongoing feedback and assessments can be made. This also ensure that children are engaging with their work and strong links of communication remain between the school and parents/children. Tapestry is checked daily to enable this to happen.

The current topic in Class 1 is space themed with literacy texts focusing around The Smeds and The Smoos and the poem, Alien Stole My Underpants.

Weekly Zoom meetings are being held for wellbeing checks and tasks.

Home Learning Packs

Home learning packs have been sent home for the children containing literacy, maths, phonics and handwriting work. Regular updates will made available for parents as the topics/tasks change.

In addition to this, there are ad-hoc tasks based around maths, literacy and phonics that children can complete if they want an additional challenge.

Phonics

Children in Class 1 are currently on Phase 5c in phonics. This phase covers the alternative spellings. Children have access to PhonicsPlay for revision purposes as Phase 5c is new to the children. Regular inputs and video links are sent to the children to support this phase. Children have been sent home worksheets/activities to support this.

Maths

Children are currently following Oak Academy Maths. Children in Year 2 are on the unit, Addition and Subtraction of 2-digit numbers. After completing this, they will move onto Fractions covering both the year 1 and year 2 unit having missed this in year 1 owing to the first lockdown.

Children in Year 1 are on the unit, Exploring calculation strategies within 20. They will also then move on to the Year 1 fractions unit. Children have been sent home worksheets to support this.

Literacy

A fortnightly plan for literacy has been sent to the parents. This contains work each day which includes SPaG and writing tasks. This is accompanied by inputs and PowerPoints via Tapestry. Week 1 and 2 is The Smeds and The Smoos, week 2 is poetry – Aliens Stole My Underpants and week 5 and 6 will be a factual text (to be confirmed).

Geography

Children are exploring their local area which is easily accessible to them. Weekly tasks are sent out via Tapestry. Children are drawing and plotting routes on a map of their home and local area, writing directions to a local point of interest and using coordinates to find something nearby.

Class 2 – key stage two

Remote learning plan January 2021

All online links are emailed to parents and discussed with children on zoom meetings. Paper copies and workbooks are delivered or collected from school.

Maths

Children all have **CGP books** which set out the mathematical strategy the children are expected to learn and consolidate learning at their level.

All children will follow **Oak Academmy lessons** on the topic of fractions. Most children will follow the correct lessons for their age group unless otherwise directed by their teacher. Printed materials delivered at the start of term and will be printed for collection from school moving forwards

Every week we will also focus on Timestables- the children have their CGP books and also the **Timestables Rock Stars** online learning and apps which allow the children to test their knowledge on various apps. The children have their own log in to access this website.

English and SPAG

The children have **CGP books** which target their understanding of grammar and punctuation and provide exercises to help children practice these techniques.

The children are all reading the same text, *The Secret Garden*, for guided reading and English lessons. We will also expect them to continue to reading their own book of choice for enjoyment. The children will be expected to read these texts at home and we will have ZOOM lessons twice weekly where we can discuss the story and characters in a group.

The children have been given a set of lesson plans. We will update these every two or three weeks.

Spellings – the children will still be able to access the Spelling Shed lists and can do the various crosswords and puzzles that accompany each stage.

WELL BEING WEEK 1 – 5th February

Thinking about and discussing how you feel about yourself, how you look after yourself and those around you.

A variety of fun-based activities thinking about identity and values.

RE – This term we will be looking at the five pillars of Islam using a variety of books, class activities and discussions, quizzes and online learning.

Science – The digestive system, As above but with the addition of some practical activities to demonstrate digestion.

All children working from home have a remote learning pack which includes the class text, maths worksheets to accompany the Oak academy lessons.

Each week the children attend zoom lessons where a lesson guide is provided by teacher to help children navigate the home packs and help them with to understand what is expected of them.

The children have the opportunity to share work with each other. The children in class have uploaded some of their work so children feel connected with the learning in class and at home.
