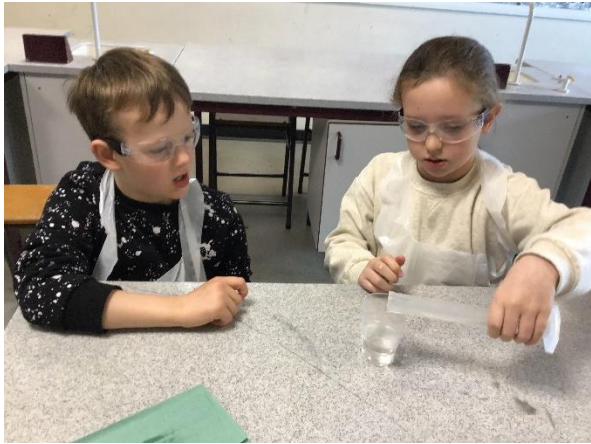




# Pott Shrigley Church School
