REMOTE LEARNING PLAN

Autumn 2020

Below is an outline of ways we plan to educate the children who attend Pott Shrigley should we have to close the school for self-isolation or as directed by government. They are not rigid plans and, as when we are physically present in the classroom, we will be responding to the needs of the children and the resources and time available to them as best we can.

We expect the children to do some learning in **maths and English (reading, writing or spoken language) every day. The younger children will also need to do some work on phonics.** We will aim to guide the children into also completing topic, RE, science etc on a rolling programme and hope that we can encourage them to do some **physical activity** every day as well. We may use BBC Bitesize and/or Oak National Academy for online learning and have prepared work on paper to send home with children where possible.

Reception and Class One Contingency Plans Autumn 2020

Tapestry:

All the children are on tapestry and parents have activated this, so will use this as the main source of communication. Parents will be encouraged to post what they have been doing with their children and this will be monitored and responded to by staff. It will also be used to suggest ideas, add document links, read stories, respond to children's ideas etc to maintain a strong link between home and school. It can then be used to pick up from where we are to continue work on a specific book, theme etc.

In Autumn Term one Reception are working on the theme of Ourselves and Class One The Sea.

Contingency plans in the event of school lock down

Maths

Children all have *CGP* books which set out the mathematical strategy the children are expected to learn and consolidate learning at their level.

In the first half term all children will be focussing on Number and Place Value. In the second half term we will look at Addition and Subtraction.

Every week we will also focus on Timestables- the children have their *CGP* books and also the Timestables Rock Stars online learning and apps which allow the children to test their knowledge on various apps. The children have their own log in to access this website.

English and SPAG

The children have *CGP* books which target their understanding of grammar and punctuation and provide exercises to help children practice these techniques.

We will send the children home with 2 different texts - one text for Lower Key Stage 2 and another for Upper Key Stage 2. The children will be expected to read these texts at home and we will have ZOOM lessons where we can discuss the story and characters in a group.

The children may be set a written piece of work to follow up these online lessons.

Spellings - the children will still be able to access the Spelling Shed lists and can do the various crosswords and puzzles that accompany each stage.

Topic - Ancient Greece

The children have been enjoying learning about the Ancient Greeks and being at home is an opportunity for them to do some research on a part of Greek History that they find particularly interesting and they can design a poster to show their discoveries:
